Christine Flowers, the OCPL director, leads NIEHS communications about COVID-19. Her role involves coordinating with the NIH Office of the Director, various other offices within HHS, and The White House.

OCPL staff assists leadership with internal and external communications. The web team continually updates internal webpages to share information about:

- Assisting staff who telework fulltime
- Planning and implementing a vaccination program for staff
