## Britons vote for the iPhone as most important invention ahead of flushing loo and space travel

The iPhone has been voted a more important invention than the washing machine, combustion engine and space travel, according to a survey.



The iPhone came eighth, while Thomas Crapper's flushing toilet was ninth. The internal combustion engine came tenth.

A study of 4,000 consumers also placed the Apple smart phone - which has sold 42 million units since its launch in 2007 - ahead of the car.

The wheel was voted as the most important invention in history, with the aeroplane in second place, the lightbulb third, the worldwide web fourth and computers fifth.

Other inventions to make the top ten included Graham Bell's telephone in sixth place, followed by Sir Alexander Flemming's discovery of Penicillin.

The iPhone came eighth, while Thomas Crapper's flushing toilet was ninth. The internal combustion engine came tenth.

Central heating (13th), painkillers (15th) and the steam engine (16th) also made the grade, while spectacles finished off the top 20.



- ***It's also a Phone!***



## CHP Launches Mobile App for Real-Time Traffic Conditions

Before you start your daily commute, you can now look up what traffic collisions or roadway hazards to avoid directly on your mobile device. The California Highway Patrol (CHP) has launched a new mobile application that provides real-time updates on where officers are responding along California's roadways. Continuously updated around the clock, the traffic reports include incident time, location and whether it involves a collision, traffic hazard or lane obstruction.

"By using this application, motorists will be able to choose an alternate route to get where they're going and avoid the congested area," said CHP Commissioner Joe Farrow. "This will help reduce frustration on the part of motorists stuck in traffic and possibly lessen the number of vehicles moving through the incident area."

Commissioner Farrow cautioned that the mobile app should only be used by a driver who is parked or by a passenger in a moving vehicle. California law prohibits motorists from reading, writing or sending a text message, or operating a mobile computing device while behind the wheel of a moving vehicle.

"Before heading out of the office or home, or while you're waiting to pick up your child from school or after an appointment, motorists can get real time traffic information through this portable app," Farrow said. "It's a valuable tool, but it must be used safely."

The new mobile app is a great way for California motorists, while they are safely parked, or their passengers while they're on the road, to stay updated on road hazards throughout the state, including: Bakersfield, Barstow, the Bay Area, Bishop, Chico, El Centro, Fresno, Humboldt, Indio, Los Angeles, Merced, Monterey, Orange County, Redding, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, Stockton, Susanville, Truckee, Ukiah, Ventura and Yreka.



- Uses the accelerometer hardware in the iPhone for real-time coaching and feedback as CPR is learned and practiced



# Heat Stress

## OSHA Heat Safety Tool

- Calculate the **heat index** for a worksite, and, based on the heat index, display a **risk level** to outdoor workers
- Then, with a simple "click," you can get reminders about the **protective measures** that should be taken at that risk level to protect workers
- Includes reminders about drinking enough fluids, scheduling rest breaks, planning for emergencies, adjusting work operations, heat illness signs and symptoms, and more
