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**2. Workshop Summary**

This presentation/discussion described two new ways to use Advanced Training Technology in training.

The UAB described and demonstrated the creation and use of resources from public domain or other free sources. Such resources include their Informational CD-ROM and durable laminated Emergency Response to Terrorism Job Aid booklets.

The SEIU described where and how to download video, and ways to modify film clips, using readily available software. The increasing availability of old government and industrial films on the Internet opens up a treasure of possibilities for their use in triggering discussion, especially in refresher classes. **3. Methods**

The UAB and SEIU demonstrated the ATT resources developed and discussed how they have and might be used.

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## 4. Main Points

### Key lessons from the case study

Similar ATT materials could be developed by trainers and training programs with less outside expertise and resources than might have been expected. Trainers have a much greater ability to create and add to curriculum, with the increase in digital information available on the Internet and other sources and more easily used and readily available software.

### Responses from the participants

Trainers are seeking references and training materials in electronic format and increasingly using the Internet as a tool. Several participants had recently successfully used some of the tools described in this workshop
