NC Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program	Education, Assistance, Screening, Support Groups
(BCCCP) Resources	and Survivorship
 Program sponsored by NC Department of Health and Human Services Provides free or low-cost breast and cervical cancer services to eligible women in North Carolina. These services can include screenings, diagnostic work-up for abnormal findings and/or assistance with application for Breast and Cervical Cancer Medicaid (BCCM). NC BCCCP services are offered at most local health departments, as well as community health centers, hospitals, and private medical provider offices across the state. For more information on your BCCCP provider, click the link below Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program County (BCCCP) Provider Locator Website BCCCP Eligibility You are eligible if you are: Uninsured or underinsured; Without Medicare Part B or Medicaid; Between the ages of 40-64 for breast screening services and 21-64 for cervical screening services; and Household income at or below 250% of the federal poverty level. Effective Oct. 1, 2020, women who are diagnosed by a non-BCCCP participating provider, and who meet all other NC BCCCP eligibility criteria, may be eligible to apply for BCCM. 	 Sisters Network Inc. Breast and Cervical Cancer Medicaid (BCCM)

Provides funding for treatment to women who are diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer and who meet NC BCCCP eligibility requirements.

Eligibility

- Patients must be referred to the local NC BCCCP to apply for BCCM;
- Women with family incomes at or below 250% of the Federal Poverty Level, who are uninsured or underinsured, and who are not covered by Medicare Part B.


