Attention North Carolina Environmental Justice Leaders!

NIEHS Women's Health Awareness is providing **SCHOLARSHIPS** for **up to 20 environmental justice community leaders** from across North Carolina **to attend the [2024 Women's Health Awareness \(WHA\) Conference](#)** on Saturday April 13 at Hillside High School in Durham North Carolina and host a local event in your community!

Scholarships will provide funding to:

1. Travel to attend the WHA conference on April 13
2. Host a local community meeting or town hall

Scholarship recipients will receive a total of \$600 broken down as follows:

- \$300 prior to WHA Conference on April 13
- \$300 after completing all scholarship requirements

Scholarship Requirements:

1. Attend the WHA conference on April 13.
2. Following the conference, plan and host a local meeting or town hall where you will:
 - Report back to your community and share information, resources, and opportunities learned at the WHA conference;
 - Collect feedback from local meeting participants about your community's environmental public health and environmental justice needs and concerns; and
 - Develop a short report outlining your community's environmental justice concerns and lived experiences for them and their families.

These reports will help to inform the development of future WHA interventions, research opportunities and community-related services that will help to increase the health resiliency of your communities!

1. Your name, email address and phone number;
2. Your community;
3. 250 words or less on your experience with Environmental Justice in your community and why you wish to attend the WHA 2024 Conference;

4. 250 words or less on your plan to host a community event in your area. Do you have a space in mind? Do you have an organization you can partner with? Who do you plan to reach out to attend? Have you ever hosted a local meeting or town hall before?
