
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

- Collect data
- Evaluate data and programs
- Identify health priorities with tribes
- Make recommendations for health service needs
- Make recommendations for improving health care delivery systems
- Provide epidemiologic technical assistance to tribes and tribal organizations
- Provide disease surveillance to tribes

# INDIGENOUS DATA

### Definition

- "Indigenous data include, "any facts, knowledge, or information about a Native nation and its tribal citizens, lands, resources, programs, and communities.
- •Information ranging from demographic proles to educational attainment rates, maps of sacred lands, songs, and social media activities are all data."

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# INDIGENOUS DATA SOVEREIGNTY

Definition – "Indigenous data sovereignty is the right of a nation to govern the collection, ownership, and application of its own data."

**Definition** - "Indigenous data governance is decision making. It is the power to decide how and when Indigenous data are gathered, analyzed, accessed, and used"

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


