
How can we help you?

How can we help?, continued

• Creation of a "voluntary" respiratory protection program for workers and volunteers.



- Especially for workers who do not have mandated OSHA coverage or whose agencies or employers refuse to provide or authorize personal protective equipment (PPE).
- MDB will convene an expert panel of PPE experts from a variety of fields to create an easyto-understand template for the creation of Voluntary PPE Programs.
- A Workers Guide to Voluntary PPE programs will assist community, public health and worker organizations in carrying out pilot programs to protect cleanup workers and volunteers.

How can we help?, continued

- Assess the effectiveness of 2022 Stafford Act training deployments to targeted large-scale declared federal disasters like Hurricane Ian in Florida.
 - The assessment would include key informant interviews and small focus groups of local,
 state and federal disaster responders in each location.
 - Assessment themes would include description of known and unexpected health and safety concerns for homeowners, responders and local community leaders; issues in debris management, rebuilding and reconstruction, infrastructure recovery and perceived ongoing mental and physical health issues.
