





- No changes were made to existing NAEHS Council standard operating procedures
- Simply codifies Council's routine operations

NIEHS 2022-2024 Triennial Advisory Council Report Certifying Compliance with NIH Policy on Inclusion Guidelines





21st Century Cures Act

- Accelerates advances and medical innovations and provides access to patients who need them
- Includes requirements for human subjects' inclusion reporting
- Requires analyses by sex, race, and ethnicity for NIH-defined Phase III and Applicable Clinical Trials (ACT)
- Requires reporting enrollment age of participants as part of the Inclusion Across the Lifespan Policy





NIEHS Inclusion Data

- NIEHS Extramural and Intramural reports are combined on Electronic Council Book
- U.S. site or non-U.S. sites reports are combined
- Metrics are reported as Inclusion Enrollment Records, or IERs
 - Can have more than one IER per study
 - Mothers/caregivers are considered separately from child in mother-child pairs
- Enrollment data includes only prospective studies reporting enrollment
- Inclusion data records labeled as existing data are excluded from reports






FY2024 Extramural Funding and Grant Distribution Overview






Comparing NIEHS and NIH RPG Success Rates Over Time






FY24 Research Project Grants (RPGs): Distribution by Mechanism RPG Total Funding: \$284.2 million




Competing RPG Funding Above and Below the Payline Unsolicited Grants (excludes un-percentiled RPGs)



Note: Payline was 10% for FY22-23 and 7% for FY24




Supporting Early-Stage Investigators (ESI) and New Investigators (NI)

Non-RPG Extramural Awards in FY2024






Superfund Appropriation



FY25 Funding Strategies

- Funding challenges have included:
 - Loss of staff
 - Delayed 'January' Council meeting
 - Changing HHS and NIH policies and priorities
- To improve our ability to efficiently make awards in FY25, DERT is:
 - Emphasizing Non-competing awards
 - Increasing the payline to 11% (15% for ESI), minimizing RTP
 - In Q4 we will be using strategies such as MYF competing and non-competing awards
