Artificial Intelligence and Breast Cancer: Myths and Realities

Artificial intelligence (AI) is rapidly becoming part of our health care journey, especially in breast cancer care. Yet, it is often misunderstood and surrounded by myths and fears. This session will demystify AI in breast cancer, explain how it is being used to improve diagnosis and treatment, and highlight its potential to support better care for breast cancer patients.

During this session, participants will be able to:

- Understand what AI is and how it is applied in breast cancer care.
- Understand AI tool development, its capabilities and limitations, and recognize myths and misconceptions in health care.
- Explore how AI can improve early detection, diagnosis, and treatment of breast cancer.
- Learn how AI can help improve access to high-quality care and support better outcomes for women.
- Gain strategies for asking informed questions and advocating for themselves as patients or caregivers.
