

Workers as Health Monitors: An Assessment of Los Angeles County's Workplace Public Health Council Proposal

An innovative idea to combat the spread of COVID-19

The County of Los Angeles faces an extraordinary task in the coming weeks as it attempts to reduce its record COVID-19 rates while fostering a beleaguered economy. Health officials observe that workplaces throughout LA County are focal points of transmission, as enforcement of public health orders has lagged in a climate of desperation and fear. Lack of access to information and inadequate reporting mechanisms for public health order violations, particularly LA County's detailed, industry-specific "Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community" (County Health Order) jeopardize public health and economic recovery. Meanwhile, the County's Department of Public Health (DPH) lacks sufficient investigators to pose a credible threat of a compliance check at the county's 244,000 businesses.

LA County Public Health Council Model

Public Health Councils

 Groups of workers trained to monitor compliances with County Health Officer Orders (HOO) at their worksites.

Certified Worker and Community-Based Organizations

 Third-party organizations certified by DPH to serve as the intermediary between public heath councils and DPH.*

LA County Dept. of Public Health (DPH)

 Collaborates with third-party organizations to address reports of non-compliance at worksites.

* Certified worker and community-based organizations will:

- Assist public health councils to understand public health orders and guidance
- Provide technical assistant to public health councils to identify non-compliance
- Help public health councils prepare reports and documentation to submit to DPH

Training and Support Organizations


 Provide training technical assistance, and other support to public health councils, certified worker orgs, and DPH.

12-hour Train-the-Trainer Course for participating worker organizations and staff interfacing with Public Health Councils




