Some key discussions:

- Participants noted that environmental health impacts are preventable; however, this is with the
 exception that the systemic injustices confronting color and class are still very real and prevalent
 factors in our society.
- Federal government should focus on prevention by looking at our environmental housing and health policies.
- Federal government should listen to and partner with frontline, grassroots, and faith-based communities and engage in periodic, strategic disaster response planning and training with community stakeholders.
- Funding needs to be distributed and tailored to environmental justice communities.
- There is a need to formalize disaster preparation into risk management plans so that it is not an afterthought.
- There is a need to create grants and incentives for building local infrastructure.
- It is necessary to educate federal, state, and local governments on environmental justice.
