














Average Annual Natural Hazard Occurrence for 1980-2020











20 hurricanes in five years

3,837 earthquakes in the past 365 days

On average, there are about 5 earthquakes recorded per day

one-third of the island is at high risk for landslides

Hurricane Maria hit Puerto Rico in 2017, it triggered more than 70,000 landslides

Approximately, 15% of Puerto Rico (524,469 people) lives in areas subject to flooding

66.7% of the population reside in coastal areas, will likely face more intense and frequent hurricanes

Hurricane Maria. The death toll was originally reported as 64 and has been revised by Governor Ricardo Rosello to 2 975 but the 2018 Harvard survey study estimated that perhaps as many as 4 645 fatalities had occurred

About 34% of Puerto Ricans reported having fair or poor health (18% mainland US)

Asthma rate is 12.2%; the mainland's is 9.4%.

Puerto Rican children are three times as likely to have asthma, as compared to non-Hispanic whites
