Combine the community and emergency responders

- Training for emergency responders
- Regular drills and exercises can help the community and emergency responders practice their response plans and identify areas for improvement.

- Mock drills and exercises
- Emergency responders such as firefighters, police officers, and medical personnel should receive regular training to ensure they are prepared to respond to disasters





Collaboration and Coordination

Collaboration and coordination among all stakeholders including local government, emergency responders, community organizations, and businesses can help ensure a coordinated response to disasters








