



The Ovarian Health Study

Women, 25-29 years old, who are **not currently taking birth control pills or hormones**, and live in and around Raleigh, Durham, or Chapel Hill, North Carolina, are invited to join an important study to find an easier way to detect a hormone produced in the ovaries. The study is being conducted by the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS), part of the National Institutes of Health.



What's required?

- One visit to donate blood and two urine samples
- Samples will be collected at the NIEHS Clinical Research Unit in Research Triangle Park, North Carolina

Volunteers will be compensated up to \$65

Who can participate?

Healthy women aged 25-29 who:

- Are not pregnant and not breastfeeding
- Have not used tobacco or nicotine products in the past 6 months
- Have not taken birth control pills or hormones in the past 3 months
- Have not had Depo-Provera shots in the past 6 months
- Have not taken any prescription medications in the past month
