

## 2. Workshop Summary:

The First-in Engine course utilizes the RINSED mnemonic (first proposed by Fridley Fire Department) to assist in the organization of a hazardous materials scene by the first-in engine crew. The objectives of Recognize, Identify, Notify, Scene security, Evacuation and Decontamination are reviewed. The class is divided into teams and each team is provided with a hazardous materials spill scenario and the First-in Responder Incident Action Plan Worksheet to complete and present to the class.

#### 3. Methods:


- 1. Presentation of a PowerPoint Program defined the competencies required by the HAZWOPER Standard for Hazardous Materials Awareness Level responders.
- 2. Participants were divided into groups of 2 or 3 and were provided with an example of a hazardous materials spill. Each group utilized the DOT ERG to complete the First-in Responder Incident Action Plan Worksheet (RINSED Mnemonic).
- 3. Each group reported to the class a summary of the information recorded in their incident by reviewing the completed First-in Responder Incident Action Plan Worksheet (RINSED Mnemonic).

# 4. Main Points/Key Points Raised from Participants:

1. Participants stated that the PowerPoint presentation covered the competencies required for a Hazardous Materials Awareness Level responder.







- 2. Participants stated that the First-in Responder Incident Action Plan Worksheet (RINSED Mnemonic) was a useful tool to document information and actions taken at a hazardous materials incidents at the Awareness Level.
- 3. Some participants requested a copy of the PowerPoint presentation and a copy of the First-in Responder Incident Action Plan Worksheet (RINSED Mnemonic) document to use in their jurisdiction.
